Pastoral Care

FRIENDLY and CARING SCHOOL

Though Ballymena Academy is a large modern school, it is friendly and caring.

If a pupil is anxious or in difficulty someone from our extensive Pastoral team of staff and pupil mentors will be available to help. All Teachers share in Pastoral Care providing a safe, encouraging environment in which pupils can grow.

Parents are key pastoral care partners and are strongly encouraged to contact the school if in any way concerned about their child's well-being. Pastoral issues are discreetly and sensitively addressed in the context of both school situations and broader health, personal and social circumstances.

There is a pastoral team in each year group comprising a year head, a pastoral adviser and class tutors to assist pupils

and their parents with any challenges which arise. A wider network of pastoral support exists through the provision of a wide range of pupil mentors, a full time school nurse, counsellor, and access to information about relevant external agencies. An extensive pastoral programme permeates the school year, helping to educate and support our pupils in their personal development.

Procedures exist for early identification of pupils with special educational needs for whom appropriate provision is arranged in consultation with parents and, where necessary, other support agencies.

In keeping with our positive ethos and the good relationships which characterise our school, we encourage children and young people to act responsibly and with respect for others.













The Curriculum

Ballymena Academy provides a wealth of learning experiences and opportunities which equips pupils with relevant knowledge, understanding and skills to become successful learners, confident individuals, responsible citizens and effective contributors.

The range of subjects on offer is extensive. On-site, our pupils have access to a very wide range of GCSE, AS, A Level and other Level 3 courses, which extends beyond the statutory requirements. The curriculum is reviewed annually and is shaped to meet the needs, abilities and interests of our young people. In addition to the comprehensive range of subjects in the

arts, environment and society, languages, learning for life and work, sciences and technology, recent additions such as Agriculture, Mandarin, A Level Physical Education, Engineering, Government and Politics, Environmental Technology and customised skills development courses, have brought the school acclaim for its innovative approach to curriculum design. The outstanding Careers Education and Guidance Programme was recognised in the attainment of the Gold Standard Award by the international careers service 'Prospects'. Ballymena Academy is the first school in Northern Ireland to attain this prestigious award.



Ballymena Academy provides a very wide range of recreational, cultural, social, business and environmental activities that are the envy of schools throughout the country. 
