MANDARIN AT BALLYMENA ACADEMY

As part of a broad and balanced curriculum here at Ballymena Academy we provide pupils will opportunities to experience new subjects that they might not have studied previously.

In Year 8 at Ballymena we teach Mandarin, with the subject being led this year by Lily, from the Confucius Institute. We sat down with Lily this week to find out about her hobbies and interests, her home city in China and what her experience of BA has been like so far.

Hi, Lily. Can you tell us a little bit about yourself including what your school experience was like?

Hi, everyone. I am Lily. My Chinese name is Zha Lijuan. I am from Anhui Province. There is a very famous river (Yangtze River) running through my hometown – Anqing City. Before I came to NI, I had been teaching Mandarin in Indonesia for about 2 years. My pupils were seniors, almost 16 or 17 years old. It was a happy time there. I still keep in touch with some friends and pupils. Now I am here and I am experiencing another teaching life full of new experiences.

How did you become involved with the Confucius Institute and make you way to BA?

My major is a Master of Teaching Chinese to Speakers of Other Languages. I enjoy teaching and also like to experience the culture of different countries.



The Confucius Institute is like a bridge connecting my dream and reality. When I got the offer, my journey began in Indonesia and has now brought me to Ballymena Academy.

What have you been doing this year in BA?

I started here last October. I teach Y8, Y9 and some Y14 pupils Mandarin. I prepared more than 20 topics about greetings, names, nationality, numbers, family, age and so on. After 6 or 7 topics, pupils can do a brief self-introduction such as, "Hello, my name is Lily. I am Chinese. There are 5 people in my family. They are ..." in Mandarin and I show them some traditional Chinese culture, for example Chinese zodiac, panda, Spring Festival, paper cutting and so on.

I also encourage pupils to enter various competitions run by the Confucius Institute. Almost every pupil from Y8 designed the tiger poster to celebrate the traditional Chinese new year, because 2022 is the Year of the Tiger in China.

What do you do to relax at the weekends?

I enjoy reading and have recently started growing some vegetables. I have made so many friends since coming to Ballymena Academy who have given me lots of opportunities to see NI at the weekends. I have completed some hikes with Mrs Smyth's walking group. I play table tennis with Mr Houston and Mr Munce on Friday afternoon. Mrs Connor has taken me to the theatre to see 2 different musicals and Mrs Douglas, Miss Forsythe and Miss Coulter have taken me on lots of different adventures.

What has impressed you most about the pupils at Ballymena Academy?

I can still recall my first week in Ballymena Academy. I had lost my way in the big teaching building when a pupil passed by me and said "Do you need a hand Miss?" He pointed me in the right direction, which was so mannerly.

After teaching Mandarin for a week, it seemed that every pupil I met was greeting me "hello" in Mandarin, even those I was not teaching.

I feel so welcome and respected here. Last month was my birthday and some pupils sang the birthday song to me and made birthday cards for me. I was very touched. In my eyes, the pupils are studious, moral, creative and compassionate.
