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WELCOME - MR NICHOLL

In September we were delighted to welcome Mr John Nicholl as Head of Boys' P.E. and Director of Rugby. In this short interview Mr Nicholl shares his rugby memories whilst playing for Ballymena Academy as a pupil and what he hopes to achieve in his new role.

What are your best rugby memories both from your playing career and your coaching career?

My best rugby memory as a former pupil of Ballymena Academy is getting to the Medallion Shield final in 2001. We were undefeated for the whole season but unfortunately lost in the final to MCB at Ravenhill.

I remember the buzz and excitement of arriving like a professional at Ravenhill and running out in front of the school's supporters. It was a very special feeling followed by heart break at the final whistle. A great memory regardless.

As a fan of the game, I felt very fortunate to be on the Ballymena RFC 1stXV coaching team when Ballymena were promoted in the All Ireland League in 2014. We had to win on the last day of the season, which we did, defeating Barnhall at Eaton Park in front of our home supporters. That was a very special feeling and my first experience of success as a young coach.

How have you enjoyed your time at Ballymena Academy so far?

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time so far. As a past pupil, I am fortunate to know my way around the school and some of my old teachers are still here; it was nice to see some familiar faces when I started in August.

All the staff have made me feel very welcome, especially in the P.E. department.

What do you hope to achieve in your new role as Director of Rugby?

In my last school I really enjoyed the pastoral element of teaching and I hope to continue that link with the pupils of Ballymena Academy.



On the rugby side of things, I hope to provide coaches with a platform to grow and get involved with teams. I also hope to continue to increase the numbers of pupils playing rugby and see them play the game for as long as possible. Success comes in many ways for rugby players at Ballymena Academy, and I am sure we will continue to win competitions, play fair, competitive rugby and educate our players about the important values that come from within the game.

One of my own personal goals does include winning Schools' Cups.

What advice would you give to young aspiring rugby players in school?

Train hard, listen and apply yourself. Be the best version of yourself every time you take the field. Don't be afraid to make mistakes and be creative, but above all else be a good person and enjoy your sport!

Rugby is a simple game which I would encourage every pupil to try. Pupils can make friends and memories for life through the game.

I am here today at this school because of the doors that my own teachers and the game itself offered me when I first started at Ballymena Academy. Simply put, get involved!
